WHAT DOES ITALIAN EASTER BREAD SYMBOLIZE?

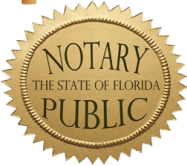


There is a variance of stories behind the meaning of Italian Easter bread. The story I most relate to contains Christian symbolism behind it. Just as bread is a daily sustenance of life, so is the body of Christ who sacrificed himself so that we may have new life. Jesus Christ is the bread of life.

Traditional Easter bread is braided with three ropes. The three ropes symbolize the elements of the Holy Trinity (the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit) and the braided wreath represents the crown of thorns Jesus wore on the cross during his crucifixion. The eggs represent the new life we have in Christ.
